Finding and Researching Companies

Company Information Databases at the Library

Business databases can be accessed through the library's homepage, www.ny.devry.edu/library. Click on "Library Databases", and choose the one you want to use. In order to use the databases from outside the school, you will need the usernames and passwords, which are available from the library. Come in or call (718) 269-4241, and have your D# ready. If you need instructions on how to use the databases, you can come into the library for help, call us at the number above, or use "The Library Survival Kit," which is available on our homepage under "Handouts".

Moody's is a database of detailed information on publicly held companies. It is searchable by company name or by other factors such as SIC codes.

Faulkner is a database about the business side of the computer and technology industry. It is searchable either by company or industry.

Hoover's is a database that covers privately and publicly held companies, both domestic and international. It is searchable by company name or industry, and it is possible to limit the hits by locality, by company size, earnings and other criteria. This is the best company information database that we have. If you sign up for their free service, by clicking on "E-Mail Alerts", Hoover's will send you updates about your company.
